REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

March 18, 2019

PRESENT: Mayor Carswell, Vice Mayor Lewis, Council Members Anderson, Williams, Jones and Byne, City Manager Coalson, City Attorney Dube

ABSENT: Council Member Tinley

1. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Carswell at 6:30 p.m.
2. Council Member Byne gave the invocation.
3. Council Member Williams led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.
4. Council reviewed the minutes and Executive Session minutes from the Regular Council Meeting held on March 4, 2019. Council Member Byne made a motion to approve the minutes and Executive Session minutes from the Regular Council Meeting held on March 4, 2019. Vice Mayor Lewis seconded the motion. Council voted unanimously in favor of the motion.
5. The following proposals were received in response to the City's Request for Proposals for new or used roll-off trucks. Council agreed by unanimous consent to accept the proposals as information. City Manager Coalson will review the proposals in detail and present a recommendation to Council at a future meeting.

The plan will be brought to Council for final approval at the next regular council meeting.

Following discussion, Vice Mayor Lewis made a motion to place the Police Department under the direct supervision of the Mayor and Council instead of the City Manager. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion. Council Members Anderson, Williams and Vice Mayor Lewis voted in favor of the motion. Council Member Byne voted against the motion. Council Member Jones abstained from voting. The motion carried 3-1-0.
11. Minutes from the Finance and Personnel Committee Meeting held on March 5, 2019 were provided to Council. Chairwoman Anderson gave Council a report of the meeting.
12. With no further business on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned at 7:27 p.m.

WHEREAS, the *Burke County Joint Comprehensive Plan 2018-2028* was prepared in accordance with the 2018 Rules of the Georgia Department of Community Affairs, Minimum Standards and Procedures for Local Comprehensive Planning; and

WHEREAS, the *Burke County Joint Comprehensive Plan 2018-2028* has been reviewed by the Central Savannah River Area Regional Commission and the Georgia Department of Community Affairs and found to be in compliance with the “Minimum Standards and Procedures for Local Comprehensive Planning;”

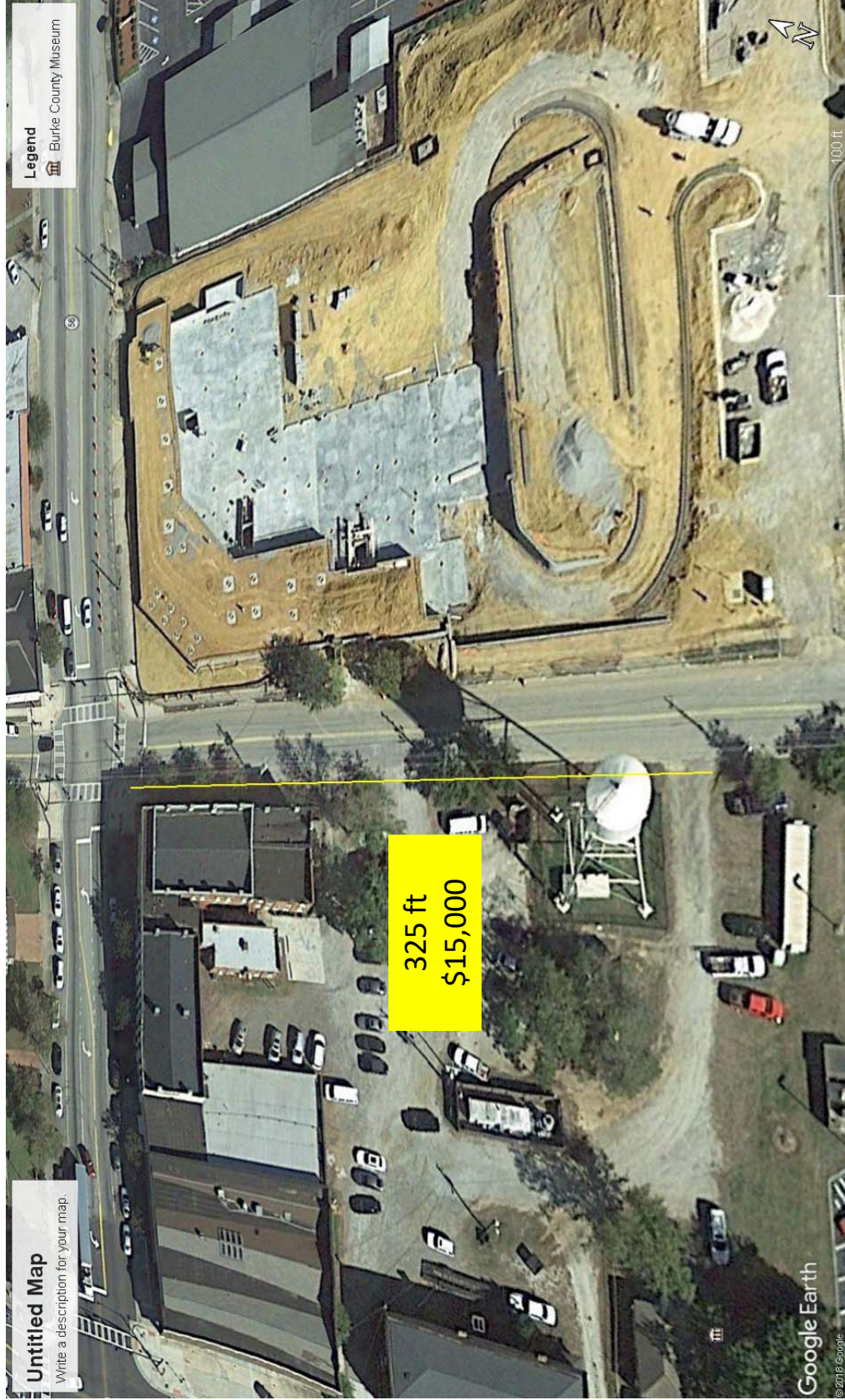

Re: Family Y Memberships

The Family Y is enrolling new members from Burke County. The City Council may want to consider providing memberships to City employees to support the development of the Family Y in our community and to encourage employees to manage their health and overall wellbeing. I have discussed the opportunity with Mr. Randell Collins who will be our District Branch Executive Director. He has provided a proposal where the City can pay for and provide a membership to all employees for \$45 each per month. This will cost \$45,000 per year. I do not recommend this approach.

Instead, I recommend that the City reimburse employees for their enrolling in the Family Y under a City discount for their usage. The cost would still be \$45. However, Council can set a usage requirement for eligibility for the reimbursement. As an example, if the employee visits and uses the facilities at the Family Y 6 times each month, the City could reimburse the employee for his/her monthly membership fee. The threshold to be eligible for reimbursement could be set at any number. The Family Y will provide a list of how many times our employees used the facility. You could also set additional benefits for employees who are more dedicated as recognition, a nice water bottle, towel, etc.

If 25 employees took advantage and used the facilities, the cost to the City would be \$13,500 each year. This is less than 3 percent of our overall medical insurance cost. Signing up during this period will save the \$75 sign-up fee.

The Y will also allow families to join for an additional \$20 if done by draft.

This is an outstanding benefit to offer to the employees and a great way to support the success of the Family Y in our community.
